Chill Out in the IceCave!

For a real experience in contrast, visit the Land of Fire & Ice. Situated on the Continental Divide among Ponderosa Pines at an elevation of almost 8,000 ft., this area has been called "the most moon-like expanse of country on Earth." The ancient lava trail leads you to a collapsed lava tube. Inside the Ice Cave, the temperature never rises above 31° F. Here, the natural layers of perpetual ice glisten blue-green in the reflected rays of sunlight.

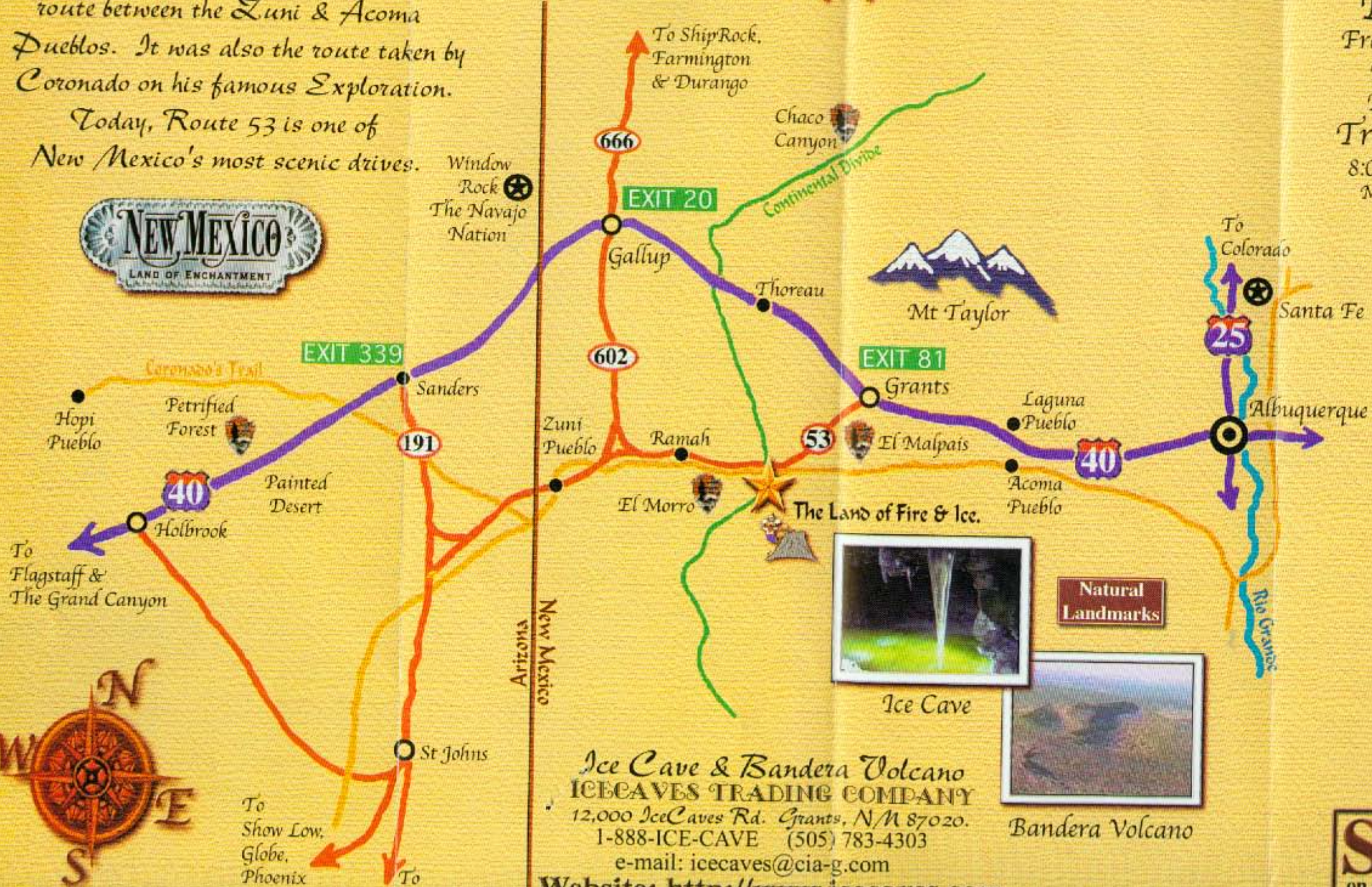
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New Mexico's Route 53
